Dr Steven Wong

Dr Steven Wong is the Consultant Anaesthesiologist of the Department of Anaesthesiology, Queen Elizabeth Hospital. Dr Wong graduated from the University of Hong Kong, and has attained the Fellowships of the Hong Kong College of Anaesthesiologists, Australian and New Zealand College of Anaesthetists and the Hong Kong Academy of Medicine (Anaesthesiology); as well as the Diploma in Pain Management of the Hong Kong College of Anaesthesiologists.

Dr Wong's main clinical interest lies in management of pain and in particular interventional pain management. He is the Head of the Pain Management Team of Queen Elizabeth Hospital. He is the Chairman of Board of Pain Medicine of the Hong Kong College of Anaesthesiologists. He is the Immediate Past President of the Society of Anaesthetists of Hong Kong and is currently the Vice-President of the Hong Kong Pain Society. Dr Wong is also a member of the Multidisciplinary Panel on Neuropathic Pain.

Dr Phoon-Ping Chen

Dr PP Chen is the Chief of Service of the Department of Anaesthesiology and Operating Services at Alice Ho Miu Ling Nethersole Hospital and North District Hospital, and Director of the Pain Management Centre of the New Territories East Cluster. Dr Chen completed his medical degree at the University of Melbourne, Australia, and then trained as an Anaesthesiologist in Hong Kong and Melbourne. He subsequently underwent pain medicine training at the Pain Relief Unit at Churchill Hospital in Oxford. He is a fellow of the Hong Kong College of Anaesthesiologists, the Australian and New Zealand College of Anaesthetists (ANZCA), and the Faculty of Pain Medicine of the ANZCA.

Dr Chen's interest in pain medicine ranges from acute pain management, neuropathic pain management and cognitive behavioural intervention. He has authored or co-authored more than 50 original articles, abstracts and book chapters, and edited two books on pain medicine. Dr Chen is a Past President of the Hong Kong Pain Society and the former Chair of the Board of Pain Medicine, Hong Kong College of Anaesthesiologists. He is also a founding member of the Multidisciplinary Panel on Neuropathic Pain. He now chairs the Multidisciplinary Pain Medicine Committee at the Hospital Authority.

Dr Chun Por Wong

Dr Wong is concurrently appointed as Chief of Integrated Medical Services & Consultant Geriatrician in-charge of Ruttonjee & Tang Shiu Kin Hospitals. He has practiced geriatric medicine since 1981 and steered the development of geriatric services of Ruttonjee Hospital since 1992. He has special interests in community geriatric services and neurological diseases in the elderly. Dr Wong is also the Service Director (Primary and Community Health Services) of the Hong Kong East Cluster of hospitals. Since 1993, he has pioneered several community projects, including the Community Geriatric Assessment Teams, High Risk Elderly Database, Telephone Nursing Consultation Service and the Hospital Admission Risk Reduction Program for the Elderly.

Dr Wong is council member of the Hong Kong Academy of Medicine, Hong Kong College of Physicians and Hong Kong Geriatrics Society, and has been very active in the education and accreditation of Geriatric Medical Training in Hong Kong. He is a member of the Multidisciplinary Panel on Neuropathic Pain and Hong Kong

Cardiovascular Task Force. He has also a special interest in health informatics and is the chairman of the Hong Kong Society of Medical Informatics, a Past President of Asia Pacific Association for Medical Informatics, and an editor of the *International Journal of Medical Informatics*, *Asia Pacific Electronic Journal of Health Informatics* and *Health Informatics Research*.

Dr Tak-Hong Tsoi

Tak-Hong Tsoi is a specialist in neurology and consultant physician at Pamela Youde Nethersole Eastern Hospital. He completed his medical degree in Hong Kong and Diploma of Clinical Neurology at the University of London, United Kingdom, and is a fellow of the Royal College of Physicians of London, the Royal College of Physicians of Edinburgh, the Royal College of Physicians of Glasgow, the Hong Kong College of Physicians and the Hong Kong Academy of Medicine.

Dr Tsoi is an active member of a number of colleges and professional societies, including Past President of the Hong Kong Neurological Society, Vice-President of the Hong Kong Stroke Society, Chairman of Neurology Specialty Board and Council Member of the Hong Kong College of Physicians, Director of the Hong Kong Parkinson's Disease Foundation, and PACES Examiner for the Royal College of Physicians (UK) and Hong Kong College of Physicians. He is also a founding member of the Multidisciplinary Panel on Neuropathic Pain. Dr Tsoi has contributed to more than 50 publications, including peer-reviewed papers, abstracts, consensus statements, guidelines and book chapters, in various fields of neurology.

Dr Joseph Lam

Dr Joseph Lam graduated from the Chinese University of Hong Kong in 1989. He received training as a neurosurgeon in Hong Kong and in the United Kingdom. During his service in the Prince of Wales Hospital, Dr Lam was involved in building up of multidisciplinary pain clinic. This special interest continued when he started his private practice in 2005. Dr Lam is one of the founding members of the MPNP. He is active in preparing lectures and workshops on pain management for patient and professionals.
